More than half a century after his death, Mahatma Gandhi continues to inspire millions throughout the world. Yet modern India, most strikingly in its decision to join the nuclear arms race, seems to have abandoned much of his nonviolent vision. Inspired by recent events in India, Stanley Wolpert offers this subtle and profound biography of India's "Great Soul." Wolpert compellingly chronicles the life of Mahatma Gandhi from his early days as a child of privilege to his humble rise to power and his assassination at the hands of a man of his own faith. Influenced early on by nonviolent teachings in Hinduism, Jainism, Christianity, and Buddhism, he came to insist on the primacy of love for one's adversary in any conflict as the invincible power for change. His unyielding opposition to intolerance and oppression would inspire India like no leader since the Buddha--creating a legacy that would encourage Martin Luther King, Jr., Nelson Mandela, and other global leaders to demand a better world through peaceful civil disobedience. By boldly considering Gandhi the man, rather than the living god depicted by his disciples, Wolpert provides an unprecedented representation of Gandhi's personality and the profound complexities that compelled his actions and brought freedom to India.

Ten practical tips for happiness are presented: nurture mind, nurture body, nurture soul, perform activities leading to mind-body-soul balance, practise mind-body-soul nurturing, live in the moment, live for a cause larger than yourself, set goals, objectives, visions and missions - be a systems thinker, use your resources effectively, and practise, practise, practise - it makes you better. A quick 2-minute quiz helps you determine your level of happiness, and guides you on your own pathway to happiness. The second part of the book shows how Dr. Appu Kuttan developed the Happiness System. The life story of Dr. Kuttan from his early years to his successful professional and philanthropic work is summarised, illustrating how he has developed and practised the happy executive concepts everyone can benefit from and use daily. This section includes several photos at the end of each of the three chapters. The third part of the book contains a systems approach for a happy India. He also notes that this "will of course include experiments with non-violence, celibacy and other principles of conduct believed to be distinct from truth."
