This book is a collaboration between a biblical scholar (Mary Ann Beavis) and a practical theologian (HyeRan Kim-Cragg) who are concerned with the way that the Bible is portrayed and interpreted in popular culture, including but not limited to the movies. This concern points to a need for a conversation, examining what the Bible actually says, in order to uncover transformations

and distortions of the biblical stories in the wider culture--including Christian culture. Our conversation is counter-cultural, not in an oppositional way, but taking an alternative posture that aims to provide different insights by drawing from and closely looking at the Bible. The chapters take a Christian canonical approach, articulating "what the Bible says" (and doesn't say) with regard to culturally pervasive themes such as sin and salvation, Christ and Antichrist, heaven and hell, in contrast to popular understandings as disseminated in (primarily) film, advertising, television, etc. We hope that together we will open up fertile academic, ecclesial, and secular space for disclosing loaded cultural and ideological views towards offering positive and intriguing insights embedded in the Bible.

The Book of Revelation has been a mystery to many people for many years. One of the basic roadblocks to understanding the Book of Revelation has been the fact that there is no Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus spoke of the coming "Tribulation" and mentioned the "Abomination of Desolation" - which occurs inside the Temple (Mathew 24: 15-21; Mark 13:14-19). But from AD 70 until May

1948 - Neither the Temple nor the Nation of Israel existed. The intent of this book is to hold the Bible up as the absolute authority on all theology on selected topics that are presented differently by denominational interpretations that may be based on tradition or opinions of human writers who have other views. Raised in a Christian home, our family of 9 (I am the oldest of 3 brothers and 3 sisters) were in church whenever the doors were open. It was an independent Bible church with a basic Baptist theology except that it was taught that legal church membership was a step too far into legalism. During an enlistment in the U.S. Air Force, I became exposed to a denomination that didn't accept Christmas or water baptism, teaching the latter to have been a part of the Law of Moses and therefore a sin for the church of today. During my life I have studied the Word to try to understand why we have doctrinal differences on this and other topics. This book is the product of these studies although I held back on going public with my

views for fear that I may lead other Christians astray. Lately, however, I have become convicted that keeping quiet may, in fact, be contrary to God's will for my life. He has also come to realize that their book, the Qur'an, makes claims about Christianity and history that simply aren't true.
